Why Dual Enroll?

- Local school district pays tuition. Classes can be free to students, depending on residency.
- Complete up to one year of college before high school graduation

Steps to Dual Enroll

1 Apply to NMC

➤ nmc.edu/applynow

2 Request High School transcript to be sent to NMC

3 Submit Enrollment Authorization Form

- Select possible classes you want to take
- The high school needs to approve the classes
- This form does not actually register you in any classes

4 New Student Orientation*

➤ Once admitted, complete orientation before you can register for classes

*For first time dual enrolled students only

5 Register for classes!

Did you know?
Dual-enrolled TCAPS students typically earn 6-12 credits (2-4 classes) by graduation.

FAQs

What are the requirements for a teen to dual enroll?

- One parent must be a Michigan resident.
- The student must be enrolled in at least one high school class at a Michigan high school.
- The student must achieve either ENG 111 or MTH 111 placement to be admitted for dual enrollment.

Talk to an NMC advisor or your high school counselor about placement requirements.

You can earn 30+ credits at NMC—FREE

Some past dual-enrolled students have started college as sophomores!

Advantages of NMC courses vs. AP classes

NMC Courses:

- > Transfer credits
- > Takes 1 semester
- > Offers college experience

AP Classes:

- > Can be stressful
- > Must pass test for credit
- > Takes a full year of school

FAQs

Can home-schooled high school students dual enroll?

Yes, but the parent is responsible for payment.

Can you dual enroll for multiple semesters?

Yes, but you must reapply each semester.

How many classes can high school students take via dual enrollment?

Your school district will pay for a maximum of **ten classes** for dual enrollment.

Is tuition free to me?

It depends on where you live. Most Grand Traverse County residents will get free tuition, paid by their school district.
