## What is the NMC Magazine?

A 48-Year Legacy: An award-winning, student-run literary publication serving the campus for nearly five decades that prints student, faculty, staff, and alumni creative pieces. We publish two issues a year featuring a variety of genres including fiction, nonfiction, poetry, interviews, art, photography, and design, while showcasing exploratory design formats.

**Professional Simulation:** Students don't just "write" they vote on issue themes; read, select, and edit submissions; create editorial and mood boards; design layouts for posters, table tents, PR, and magazine issues; write their own pieces, create artwork to be featured; and prepress the entire publication. As staff for the magazine they also build portfolios to showcase for future internships and employment.

**The Reward:** Committed staff members (1 full year) earn the opportunity to attend a national conference. In Spring 25 lit staff attended the Association of Writers & Writing Programs (AWP) in L.A.— the premier literary conference in North America. Most recently, this fall our design staff attended and volunteered at the American Institute of Graphic Arts (AIGA) National Design Conference in L.A.




#### AT THE CONFERENCE

## Looking to the Future



Interdisciplinary Collaborations: We are planning a group trip to an interdisciplinary conference for literary and design staffs (possibly alongside White Pine Press students) for Spring 2027. We include the Typography VCA classes in the grid design and layout stages of the semester and students from Creative Writing to encourage Experiential Learning.

Career-Minded + Lifelong Learning: Each semester we create more nuanced staff roles including Staff Photographer, Illustrator, Archivist, Cover Designer, PR specialist, and Poetry Editor in addition to our established roles of Editor-in-Chief, Literary Editor, Design Editor, Design staff, and Lit staff. Crafting new focused roles allows for students to take greater responsibility and ownership of specific elements of the magazine and publication process.

Belongingness@NMC: We are organizing more social events and meetings for staff to connect with each other and other clubs on campus to heighten students' sense of community and engagement. In Summer 2026 we'll join the Scholars Hall crew featuring magazine archives as a stop on the History Walk celebrating NMC's 75th anniversary. In 2027 we'll celebrate our magazine's 50th anniversary with a special party and public reading/ art exhibition.
