Visit of Shinjuku Gyoen garden-Shinjuku Gyoen or Shinjuku Gyoen National Garden is a large public garden in Shinjuku and Shibuya,. It was originally a residence of the Naitō family in the Edo period. It later became a garden under the management of Japan Imperial Household Agency.
