

MAP

Let's take a look at MAP. MAP stands for My Academic Plan. Click on the tile labeled "MAP: Academic Plan"

Click on the "View" button next to the drop down box

This is the main page of MAP. MAP is a great tool to plan out your academic career. Here you can see basic information regarding your academics such as: Program of Study; if these are inaccurate contact Enrollment Services as soon as possible, if you've applied to graduate, if you have any holds, they will show up here. If so, speak with an advisor.

Here is the overall progress of your program of study, including; a progress bar, GPA, earned and required credits

Scroll down to "General Education Requirements." Here you can see the requirements for your program of study. Some requirements are complete. Some requirements are in progress.

Some requirements are almost complete, but may require a meeting with an advisor. Some requirements are unsatisfied. To view a specific course description, simply click the name and number. Here you can see valuable information regarding a course. Such as, a description of the course, and when the course is available to be taken, and its prerequisites.

Now you may close the Course Description window

If you look at the bottom of the page, you may see courses you've attended and what their current standing is (in progress, complete, fallthrough, insufficient, or not counted).

Scroll to the top

If you prefer a printed copy your program requirements simply click the "Save as PDF" button. From here you may click "Download" or "Print" to download or print. If you'd like to plan out what classes to take during future semesters, please speak with your advisor to jumpstart your academic plan.
